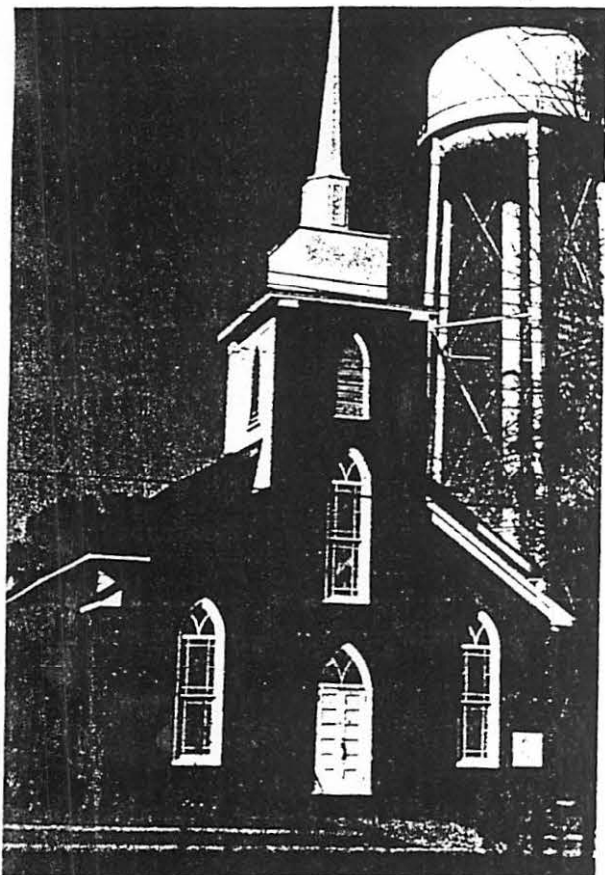

After moving from Louisburg, North Carolina in 1892, Alfred Wood and his wife Maggie Wood decided to settle down in Tarboro, North Carolina.

While attending Saint Stephen Baptist Church every second and fourth Sundays, Mr. Wood did not have anything to do on first and third Sundays. He got together with some of the men of the community and decided to start having Bible study on these Sundays at each other's homes. As their attendance grew, they found themselves needing a larger place for so many men and women.

Mr. Wood, Henry Hart, and Willie Reeves went looking for a building that could hold the large and growing attendance. One of the members found out that the late Judge Howard's family was selling the old Tarboro Presbyterian Church which was built in 1874 and was still in good shape. The members came up with a \$10.00 deposit, which the family members took in good faith.

After getting the church building, they realized that they didn't have anywhere to put it. Alfred Wood went home to talk to his wife about it. After talking in details, Mr. Wood's wife suggest they use the land they were buying from George and Harriet Holderness. They gave that land to the Church with only one request being that they move her garden. Several of the members of the Bible study group moved her

collards and the rest of the garden goods down the street on Church Street to their house.

With everything ready, Henry Hammond and a man named Mr. Wimley moved the church building on rollers and pulled it by mules from Saint James Street to the corner of Wagner and Church streets. The Church still remains in this location.

While working as a free black carpenter in the Pinetops area during the day, Mr. Wood, after getting off work, would go to the Church and do the necessary construction that it took to put the remaining underpenning to hold the Church together.

With the Church about ready to have its first service, the Bible study group decided that a name was needed for the Church. One of the members suggested that the name should be called Eastern Star Missionary Church, because they were on a mission in the east Tarboro community. It also was explained that the name originated from the second Chapter of Matthews second verse in the Bible. Which reads: "Saying where is he that is born king of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east and are come to worship him." "This should be ours main focus to bring new members to Christ," said Mr. Wood.

On a warm summer Sunday in 1907 the Church congregation dream came true. The Reverend J. H. Ramsey the Church's

first pastor, gave the people all the joy and uplifting that they could handle.

Mrs. Maybelle Parker said that her father told her that the deed was written and recorded in the court records on January 30, 1913. It was deeded to George and Lizzie Howard on December 23, 1919 to be kept until the payments were completed. On April 28, 1925 the Church land was deeded and given back to the Trustees. The deed was then burned.

The chartered members were: the Reverend J. H. Ramsey, Deacon Alfred Wood, Deacon Henry Hart, Deacon Redmond Joyner, Deacon David Key, and Brother Willie Reeves, Sisters: Caroline Pittman, Victoria Sledge, Lizzie Hart, Dora S. Barlow, Mary S. Whitley, Annie Joyner, Charlotte McNair, Eliza Lewis and Hattie Reeves.

Each year when Howard Memorial Presbyterian Church celebrated Founders day, Eastern Star Baptist Church would be used to host Howard Memorial Congregation and families for a week tour and refreshments would be served. It was like a big open house, where people of both churches would get together, reacquaint, talk over old times, and remember how the Church used to be.

Under Reverend Thomas Jones an organ was purchased. The first organist was Mrs. Maude Williams, assisted by Brother Frank Barlow on Trumpet.

From 1908 until 1995, the Church was counseled by the following mothers: Charlotte McNair (first mother), Maggie Wood, Marriah Roberts, Caroline Pittman, Clara P. Lawrence and Mary K. Crawley (the mother of the Church now.)

The first Communion set was given to the Church by Mother Charlotte McNair. From 1906-1995, Sister Lizzie Hart, Carrie Lawrence Hammonds, Cleo W. Smith, Laura B. Shield, Jamesena Joyner, Penny Dickens, Deacon Arthur Lyons, William Freeman, Janice K. Matthews and Ernestine Smith served as Financial/Clerks.

In 1925 under the Pastorship of the Reverend T. C. Everette, the Junior Choir was organized with Sister Carrie Lawrence Hammond and Sue Nelson directing. The organists were Sister Maybelle Wood Parker, Mary Sue Barlow and Hattie Lee Dancy, Sister Maybelle Wood Parker still serves as organist for the Male Choir today.

The first major repairs were done in 1957 under Reverend A. C. Morgan. A committee was formed consisting of Deacon Charlie Jernigan, Arthur Lyons, Sister Cleo Smith, Alexander Dancy and Brother James Ed Bridgers, Chairman, and repairs were done. The repairs included removing two-pot belly stoves, buying a new piano and organ, installing central heat and air conditioning and the painting of the interior and exterior of the Church.

From 1967-1981 Reverend Luther J. Morris, Sr. served as Pastor. Under his administration the dream of the new Eastern Star Missionary Baptist Church was about to take place. In 1979, a building committee was appointed. This committee completely renovated the Church by installing new carpet, a new baptismal pool, added additional bathrooms, built its first Fellowship Hall and brick veneered the entire Church. Eastern Star also remove four steeples which had a point at the top and replaced them with a one piece steeple. One of the old steeples can be seen in the hard of Alexander Dancy on Panola Street. Appliances and furniture were donated by different auxiliaries. This renovation was completed December 10, 1980. This dedicated committee was composed of Deacons: William Taylor, William J. Joyner, Arthur Lyons, Robert Hinton, Trustees: David Knight, Charlie Best, James Harrell, Carter Knight, William Ricks, Alexander Dancy, and James Ed. Bridgers, Chairman. Lay Members: Brother Johnny Wilder, Sister Shirley Mays, Sister Minnie P. Freeman, Sister Cathy Parker, Sister Ida Dickens, Sister Mary Cotten, and Sister Lillie Mae Boyd.

January 1987, Reverend Richard Earl Joyner was installed as Pastor of Eastern Star Missionary Baptist Church. Reverend Joyner has done these great works with his servants at Eastern Star: increased Sunday service to four services

monthly, documented the Church bylaws, organized a members' class, a stewardship committee, an Executive Board, gospel choir, divided the membership among the deacons. The Church membership has increased from 300 to over 400. Budget increased from \$50.00 to more than \$100,000 in 1994. A new library was added in 1988. Cushioned the Church pews in 1993 and a new computer was purchased that year.

Reverend Joyner is a man on a mission in the East Tarboro and surrounding communities. He has started several different organizations that are helping the people in the Tarboro and surrounding areas such as the Task Force, Tutoring session, and helping people who need counseling.

In 1990 Reverend Joyner started an exciting adventure. He got in contact with Rosemary Lyons Hopkins and asked her if she would get in contact with some of the Senior citizens in the community for a breakfast. As time went on Reverend Joyner called on a lady named Mary Smith, from Consolidated Diesel Company to help assist and plan a to help the people in the community.

Mary Smith broke the groups down into three small groups such as: Self-esteem, Recreation, and Employment. Out of the groups a committee was started with Reverend Joyner, J. T. Willoughby, Mary Smith, and Reverend Walston. This group called themselves the Community Enrichment Organization,

which was put in place to find a way to help the peoples in the community.

The first major project was the "Teen Car Wash". This project helped the teenagers become more aware of the meaning of responsibilities. When the teenagers washed and detailed cars, they got paid for it. J. T. Willoughby was the supervisor of the car wash and was assisted by Sammy Hopkins and Roy Gray.

Some of Reverend Joyner's other accomplishments are the Task Force, and the Tutoring sessions. The Task Force was organized to help prevent the sale of drugs in East Tarboro area. A Tutoring session was started at several schools and at Eastern Star to help teenagers with problems that they are having.

One of the shortest Psalms in the scriptures, psalms 133, verse 1 read "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unit." This is how the people at Eastern Start Missionary Baptist Church feel today, that it is pleasant for the Church to have harmony. The family, added with the Holy Spirit, love, patience and understanding. Is the harmony in the Family of Christ

The members today are still active, enthusiastic, and dedicated as they were that warm summer Sunday in 1907. Many of the faces have changed, but Maybelle Parker still play the

piano every fourth Sunday for the Male Choir and Alexander
Dancy still serve as Trustee.

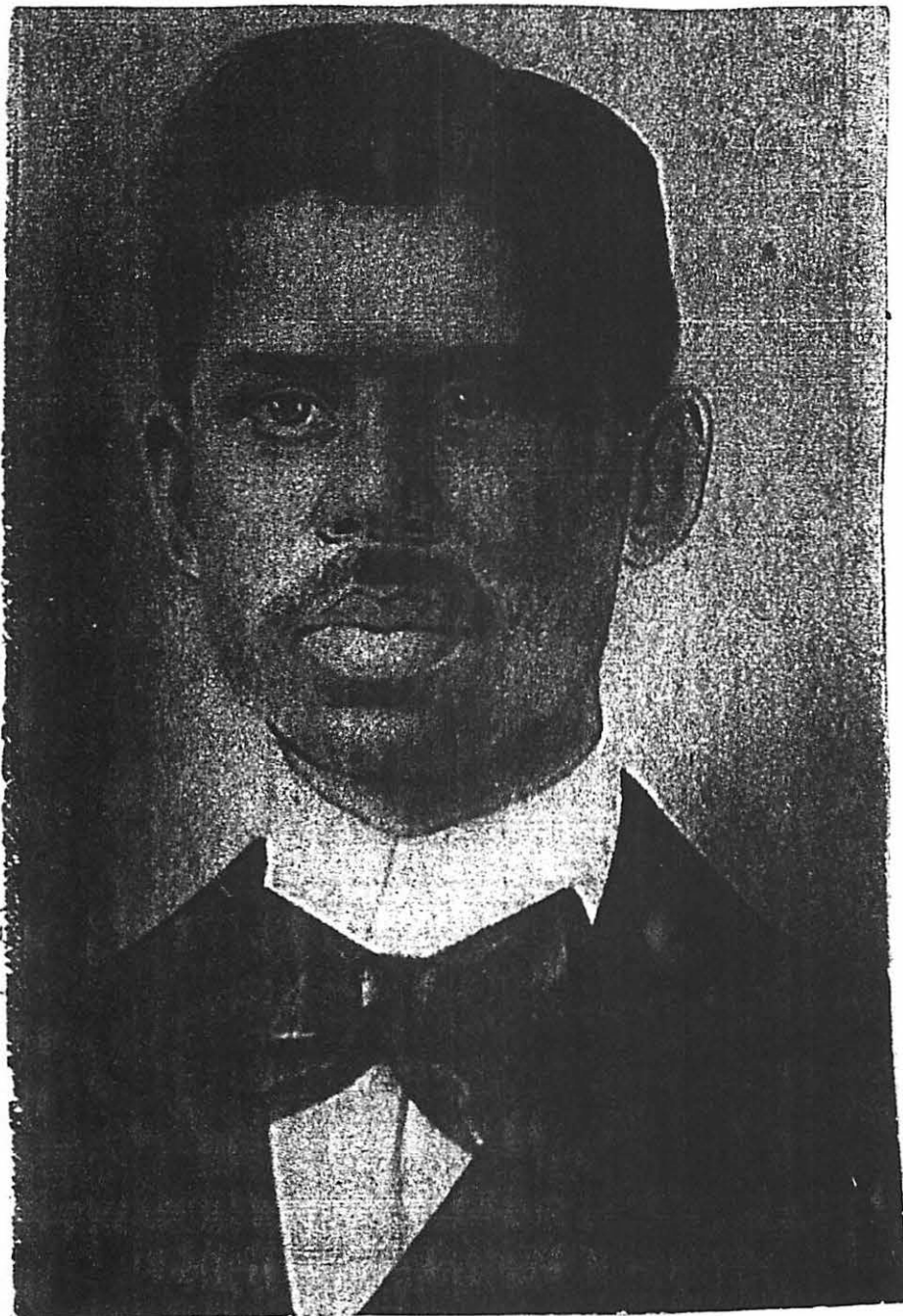

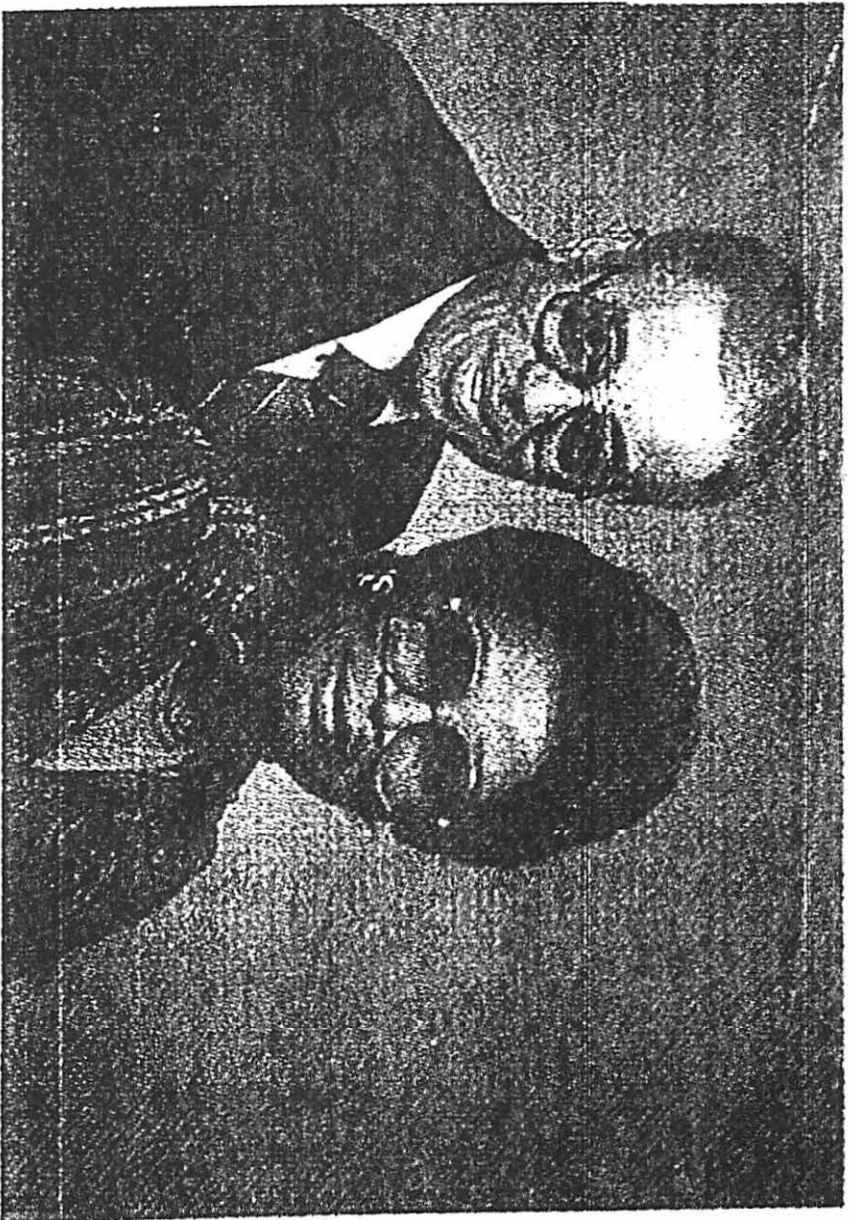
