

Supplement to my letter of 21 Nov. '73 to Cousin June

The original headquarters of Ft. Bragg is located on land owned by our Duncan which was given to his son, Alexander - My sister, Pinkie had the original Deed and turned it over to Archives in Raleigh. We will get a photostated copy to make mention in the book.

Susan, my grandmother wanted to be buried at the feet of her father, Duncan <sup>Mc</sup>Arthur and was. The graveyard was in the firing range and when mama visited her Mother's grave, the Army held up its firing.

About four years ago, I visited the site and vandals had broken up the tombstones and I, being the son of the oldest living descendent of Duncan <sup>Mc</sup>Arthur took it upon myself, along with the Paul <sup>Mc</sup>Arthurs and moved the stones (broken) lying on the ground to Cousin Paul <sup>Mc</sup>Arthur's. We intend to erect them at the Camp Ground Church - may have some kind of ceremoney - having some of the dust moved.

Caroline sister to your great, grandfather, John Franklin was visiting us (particularly Uncle Eddie) in Toccoa when she died. She is buried in the Toccoa Ga., cemetery. When I was a little boy I remember seeing her lying on her sick bed. Uncle Eddie was her favorite. The lot she owned in Fayetteville, she gave to him. I think I have a copy of the Deed. We called her Aunt Kinnie - don't know how it is spelled.

From a boy, I recall that there was more conversation about the McArthurs than the Blakes. I'll get sentimental here.
