The most eagerly anticipated social event of the year was the Junior-Senior Banquet. It was a beautiful setting of soft lights and lovely flowers.

Item XX. Janice Gibbs leaves her curiosity to Mrs. Cann.

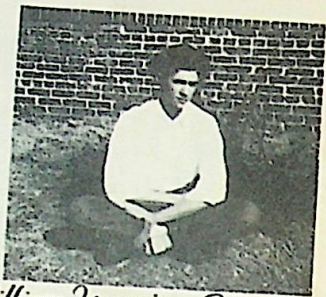
