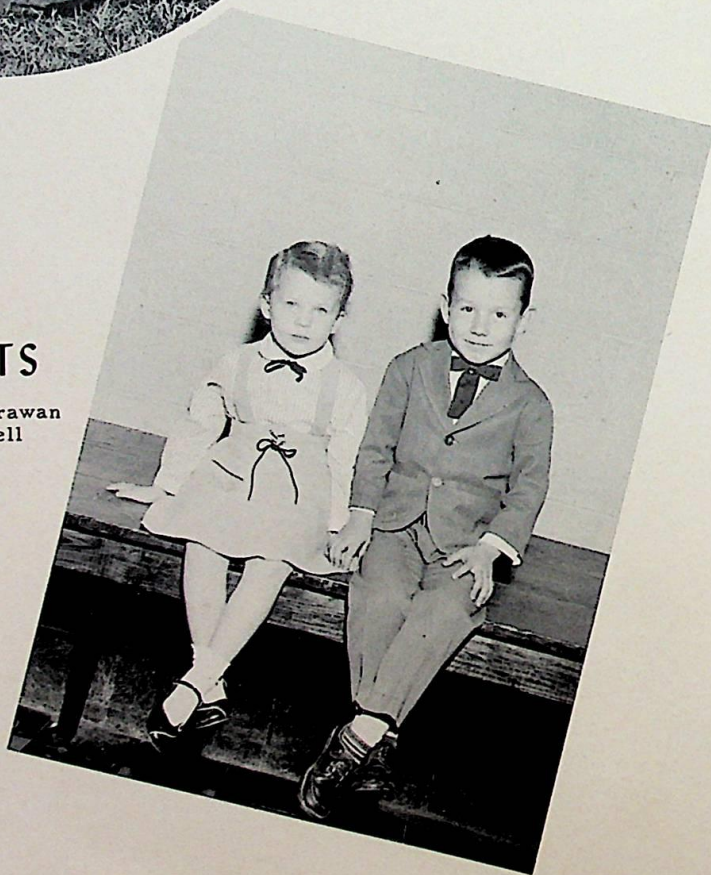

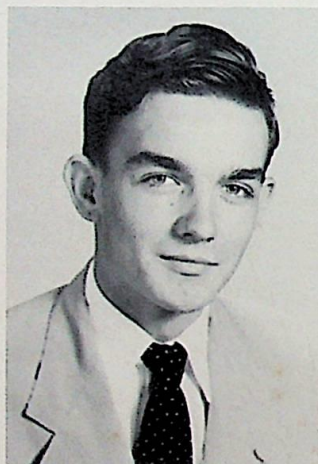

THE CLASS of 1957

As the curtain rises on the actors of a drama, so rose the curtain on the four-act drama of the class of 1957. There were thirty-six characters in the first act, the Freshman Class in 1952. From the very beginning the drama was complex and exciting though, as we soon discovered, the events were purely routine: meeting new students, forming new habits, taking new subjects, getting acquainted with not one, but five new teachers, changing classes by bells. Miss Pauline Moore, the home economics teacher, was the director of the first act.

Having formed the web, the plot became more interesting in the second act, the Sophomore Class. Mr. Gus Wooler (later replaced by Mrs. Sarah Campbell) was director of the second act with only twenty characters. The highlight of the sophomore year was a social event--the formal party the sophomores gave to honor the seniors.

The third act of the drama, the Junior Class, was full of suspense. The cast was smaller than the year before, there being only sixteen characters. The director of this act was Mrs. Carolyn Harris. The highlights were publishing the Reflector, giving the play "Peter, Beware!", and the Junior-Senior banquet at Mattamuskeet Lodge, April 20. The theme of the banquet was "Moonlight and Roses," and everything from the memory booklets to the

well in the moonlit garden where the lovely lassies and handsome laddies danced to the music of Bob Jones, bespoke "Moonlight and Roses." It was so pretty that it was worth all the hard work put into it.

The curtain rose on the fourth act, the Senior Class, August 21, 1956, with only eleven characters and Mrs. Carolyn Harris again directing. This small cast seemed more united than ever before and began working immediately on the events which led to the climax--graduation. Like the freshman year, the plot at the beginning was purely routine: selecting caps and gowns and invitations, receiving class rings, selling ads for the annual. There were four scenes: the play, "Aaron Slick from Punkin Crick," given in January; the trip to Washington, D. C., in the spring; the annual; and graduation.

As the curtain slowly fell on the graduation scene of the class of '57, the characters, full of confidence and assurance were looking forward to many worth-while performances of service in the great drama of life. Their high school career was history, and with the eleven graduates only the pleasant memories of a brilliant performance remained.

- Item 11. Jimmy Williams leaves his mechanical ability to Bill Griffin.

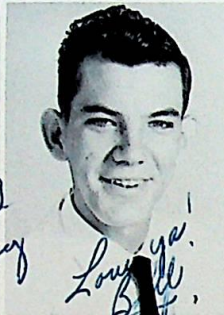
