or married and then to be Equally & Equally divided between them —
my four Daughters Susanna Anne Mary and Martha and the younger —
Susanna Martha's part to be the manner hense the which it is my Will —
that my Wife Enjoy During her Natural life It is my Will that no sale
of Timber Nor will be made upon my Land untill my Daughters be provided
for by the Land I give to my four Daughters Susanna Anne Mary and —
Martha to them and their heirs of them & after lastly by reason for
ever and it is my Will that when Daughters come to the age of twenty
one years or married that the rest of my personal Estate be Equally —
divided between them wife and four daughters I nominate and appoint my
loving Wife to have & to be of this my last Will and Testament Auditif
ing her before my Children to bring her up it is my Will that my Daughter —
Susanna to be Executor in her stead I appoint my friend brother John and Sola —
Scot to be my Overseers to see this my Will performed as Writ in my hand
