## OVERVIEW OF SEDBERRY FAMILY HISTORY

Sedberry is an English name. The original was probably Sudbury. According to Charles Wareing Bardsley in his authoritative "Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames" Sudbury is a place name, meaning a local of Sudbury, a parish in county Suffolk. "Sud" is old English for South; with the suffix "bury" meaning borough, castle, or town.

In 1638 two Sedberry men, Peter, & John landed in Virginia. Family lore has it that they were brothers, progenitors of the North Carolina Sedberry family and perhaps every Sedberry in this country.

There is a one hundred year gap in my records between these two immigrants and John Sedberry, born in Virginia about 1730. John had a son named George. George had seven sons and a daughter, all born in Virginia. The sons names (born), were JOHN (1770), JAMES H. (1776), WILLIAM (1777), GEORGE II (1778), MILES, (1781), JAMES MERRITT (1787), and DAVID (1793). George sold his land in Brunswick County, Virginia in 1795 and moved his family to a farm near Troy, Montgomery County, North Carolina. From Troy the great Sedberry diaspora commenced about 1810.

- o John moved to Arkansas Territory about 1820.
- o Descendants of James H. moved to Alabama about 1830.
- o Shadrach, son of George II, moved to Alabama after 1840.
- o James Merritt moved to Maury County, Tennessee about 1810, then about 1855 moved to Texas, near Waco, following his sons, William Rush and John Wesley.
- o William moved to Maury County, Tennessee, in 1834. Some of his descendants live in Tennessee today. His son Gates Washington moved to Kentucky, where some of his descendants can be found.

This is my understanding of Sedberry history as of today. It will change as research reveals new information.

I have yet to find a Sedberry in the United States who did not have roots in North Carolina. I think that everyone who carries the name Sedberry is related.

  - Stiles Sedberry Dixon lists Peggy, Sally, Elizabeth, Thomas & Robert as possible children of John, and comments that they may be siblings of John, rather than his children.

Comments: I have no proof that the above citations of evidence refer to the John Sedberry who is the grandfather of "The Seven NC Brothers", or even if all the citations refer to the same person, but the age is right, the time is right, the location is right and the name is unusual enough for this to be a strong candidate for the father of George Sedberry, b about 1750.

## Working hypothesis;

In 1774 the Sedberry line in the Colonies had dwindled to a very few. It may be that John Sedberry, age about 44 was the only Sedberry male of military age. John served in Lord Dunmore's war in 1774, in what is now western Virginia. I have been unable to find a Sedberry, or any variation of the name, on any Revolutionary war roster, Rebel or Loyalist.

Sometime after Dunmore's war John moved to Powhatan County, VA, where we find him in a court document in 1787. He then moves to Amelia County, VA, where he was a man of some substance. His son George, father of "The Seven NC Brothers", moved to Brunswick County, VA about 1780. George changed the spelling of his name from Sudbury to Sedberry, and thus all Sedberrys in the U.S. trace their ancestry to George's seven sons.

Note that the trip from Botetourt County, cross country to Powhatan County is about 80 miles. Powhatan to Amelia County was only about 20 miles, and from Amelia to Brunswick about 45.

From Powhatan to Amelia to Brunswick the path was directly south, heading away from the land already used up by tobacco farming, into the frontier of what is now North Carolina.

- A William Sudberry appears in the 1787 census of VA, in Amelia County. Possible son or brother of John Sudbury. See files, PLACES, VAAMO1, p341.

  - o A George Sedberry appears on the tax rolls of Brunswick County, VA, 1782-87.
  - o James Hamilton Sedberry shows George II to be the third of seven brothers, with no birthdates for any of the seven.
  - o Mrs. John Wesley (Bessie Stewart) Sedberry Jr., titles the children of George and Mary (Birdsong) Sedberry "The Seven Brothers of N. Carolina", then lists 8 brothers and their sister Elizabeth. She does give the full date of birth for each of the siblings. The brother she lists that no one else has is Seth, born Jan 23, 1784. I am surmising that Seth died young and was lost to other researchers. I have elected to use her dates since she cites "the old Merritt Sedberry Bible" as the source of her information.

- o Note that James Hamilton Sedberry gives the birth year of William, James's grandfather, as 1777, which agrees with Mrs. J.W., but he repeatedly states that William was next to the youngest of the seven. See files, SED\*5, p2.
- o From Martha Louisa (Sedberry) Hammond, (see files, SED\*8, p4). "The grandfather of James Hamilton Sedberry.....had one daughter named Lucy Birdsong Sedberry. Her grandmother was named Birdsong and her great grandmother was named Gaston. Lucy Birdsong Sedberry and Henry Birdsong Sedberry, first cousins, played together in Montgomery County as children..... Of the union between Sedberry and Birdsong there were seven children as follows. John, James, George, Elizabeth, Merritt, William and David. All reared families except David who died as a young man."

Comment: Note that Martha Louisa omitted Miles from the list of siblings. I believe her comment about David dying as a young man is incorrect. Note evidence that he served in the War of 1812, married Nancy Stancil, raised a family, and died in 1871.

!!NOTE!! The Birdsong family genealogy as presented by Dean Birdsong has Mary (Birdsong) Sedberry born about 1767, the fifth of six children. If this is correct we either have a serious problem with the the dates of birth of George & Mary's children, or "The Seven North Carolina Brothers" did not all have the same mother. Note that Mary's father, James Birdsong was born about 1726, and Merritt Birdsong, supposedly his first child was born in 1758. It seems plausible to me that Mary was James's firstborn. James would have been 29 years old in 1755, still a rather advanced age for his first child. Dean Birdsong does have a parenthetical note; "(Mary and Rebecca may not be in the proper order)". See "Five Generations of American Birdsong Ancestry" by Dean John Birdsong, p38.

o Sue Oden, writing in "The Williamson Leader", (TN), Sep 17, 1992, lists Miller as one of the 7 brothers of William Sedberry, not mentioning Seth but listing the remaining 7. I have made the assumption that Miller is the same person as Seth mentioned by Mrs. John Wesley Sedberry (above), and have presented the name as Seth Miller. Further research may prove this to be Wrong.

Comment: 1820 census is missing. John does not appear in the 1830 or 1840 Census of Montgomery County. It would appear that John left NC

o "Mrs. G. W. Monkhouse of Hondo, Texas writes that her grandfather was born July 17, 1777, married a Jefferson, and that her great grandmother

was a Birdsong." ... "Mrs. Monkhouse's father was next to the youngest of the seven sons."

- o Comment: The grandfather above seems to be George II of the "7 North Carolina Brothers." Note that this was written about 1915, wheras Mrs. J. W. Sedberry's material which gives us the birthdates of the "7 NC Brothers" was written about 1950. July 17, 1777 does not match any of the brother's birthdates as now recorded.
- o 1850 census, Montgomery County, NC shows Celia Sedberry, age 59 with Celia A. age 28, John A. age 19, Wincy B. age 23, and Harriet age 1, all born in NC.

See dwelling #269, p 120b.

- o Caution!: Children of George II and Celia Jefferson are linked by speculation and circumstantial evidence only. Reasoning as follows: o Stiles Sedberry Dixon says that George II had seven sons by his second wife, but does not have the names.
- o James Hamilton Sedberry says that George II married twice and raised two families, but does not name any of the children of the second marriage.
- o "Henry B's father was named George and his first wife was named Fletcher. By this union two sons Henry B. and Shade. The latter moved to Alabama. George married again had perhaps 7 boys and probably some girls. This marriage caused a breach in the family and the two older boys left home."

Per Martha Louis Sedberry in a short family history. See files, SEDBERRY, SED\*8, p4.

- o All of the children of the second marriage were probably born in Montgomery County, NC.
- o Montgomery County has been thoroughly researched. I believe I have the names of at least some of the children of the second marriage, but have not been able to identify the parents.
- o Those shown as children of the second marriage are those people born in Montgomery County between 1806 (2 years after Shadrack), and 1838, (George II age 60) whose parents have not been otherwise identified. o Some of these will probably be proven to be incorrect, but I have chosen this strategy to get the information in front of as many family members as possible with the hope we can find proof one way or the other.
- o 1850 census finds Celia in Montgomery County, NC, age 59, head of household, 4 children at home. Evidently George has died.
