TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING,

KNOW Ye That We, for and in consideration of the sum of *Fifty Shillings*
for every hundred acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by *W. James Gray*
have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said *James Gray*
a tract of land containing *five hundred* acres, lying and being in the county of

*Wilkes on the head waters of Deer Creek Beginning at a white oak tree
running North two hundred and forty poles to a pine tree East three
hundred and thirty four poles to a red oak tree South two hundred
and forty poles to a white oak tree West three hundred and thirty
four poles to the Beginning Including a large cove on the Brandy
mountain*

as by the plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all woods, waters, mines, minerals, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said land belonging
or appertaining: TO HOLD to the said *James Gray* his heirs and assigns forever: Yielding and
paying to us such sums of money, yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from time to time may direct. *Provided always,* That the said grantee shall cause
this grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said county of *Wilkes* within twelve months from the date hereof, otherwise the same
shall be void and of no effect.

In Testimony whereof, We have caused these our letters to be made patent and our great seal to be hereunto affixed.

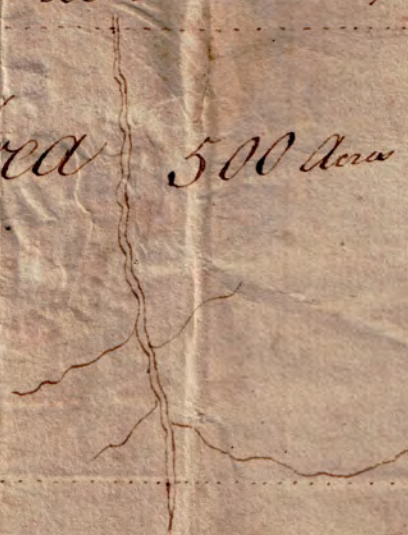
The Plan Laid down by a Scale of 100 Poles to the Inch
