Know all men by these Presents that we William Barrow Esq. and William Tomson of the County of Bath do jointly and severally bind ourselves unto each other in the full and just terms of one hundred Pounds good and lawful money of this Province upon Demand to be paid, to the Performances whereof we bind ourselves jointly by these Presents as witness our hands and date, the 28th Day of Oct. in the year of our Lord 1781.

The Condition of this Obligation is such, that if the above bounden William Barrow Esq. and William Tomson shall break any of the aforementioned articles that then the offender shall pay unto the Party offended the sum of 100 Pounds good and lawful money of this Province; but and if they both shall perform their articles of agreement as above mentioned, that then this Obligation to be void, otherwise to stand in full force and virtue.
