 my self and the Furniture thereunto belonging and all my Copper Pots
 and one Set of Iron Wedges and one Iron Pot containing three
 Gallons and one Crag and Saw. Item I Give unto my
 Daughter Martha Williamson one Lincon Spinning Wheel. Item
 I Give & Bequeath unto my four sons James, Nathan, West, and
 Daniel Harris all my Pewter as Dishes, Basons, Sperringers, Plates,
 and Trenchers to be equally divided amongst them all. Item
 I Give & Bequeath unto my Loving Wife Mary Harris all the rest
 of my Estate during her life and then to be equally divided amongst
 my Children that shall be then living I desire also that the Crag
 which is upon the Ground at my death or just made shall be equally
 divided amongst my Children that shall help to make or build the
 said Crag. I also do Appoint & Ordain my Son Nathan Harris
 to be my only & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament
 ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last Will &
 Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
