In the name of God Amen. I William F Bourdane
of the State of North Carolina, & County of
New Hanover, being weak in Body, but of
Perfect Mind, and Memory; hereby makes
the Following my Will; That is to say I will
my Body to be Buried after my soul may
leave it. in decent Christian Burial, and
what worldly goods, it has been Gods will
to Bestow, upon me herebelow after
my Just debts hath been Paid the Balance
I leave in Manner Following, That is my house,
and lot to be sold which I own in Wilmington, to
the Best Advantage, by my Executor —
to pay my said debts, and the Balance if any,
What it may fetch, I leave and Bequeath unto
my loving wife, also all Other Estate Real or
personally I do hereby profess I give unto her
hers and As heirs forever, excepting a horse
which is called the Walker horse which I give
unto my Brother in law William Robitk
In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand
and seal as my last will and Testament
This 30.th day of August 1856. I also
leave as my Executor William S. Larkin to
my wife, hoping he may have it Carried into
Effect
