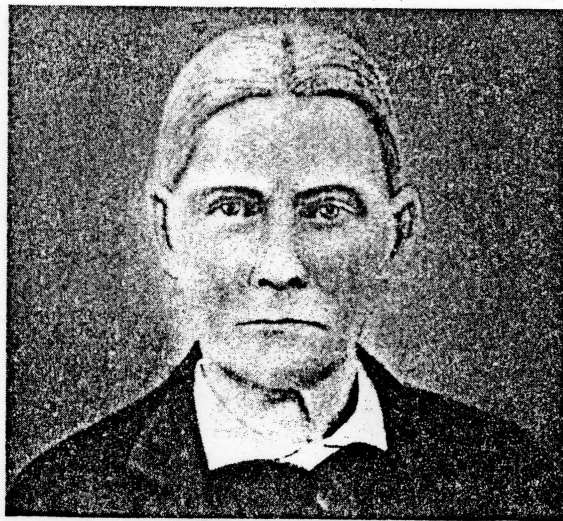

About Our Job Warrick

Job Warrick settled in Wayne County prior to 1840 near what is now the community of Grantham. His oldest two children were born in Duplin County. His son William was b 1832 in Sampson County, and his dau Nancy was born in Wayne County in 1834. The 1840 census shows Job living in Buck Swamp District, Wayne County. Job was born in Virginia, likely just across the Northampton County, N.C. line.

Job's father was Benjamin Warrick and his mother's name was Sallie. Job's father died in 1802. Job's mother is shown living with him in the 1840 and 1850 census, but not in the 1860 census. We know that he had three brothers namely: John, Thomas, and Wiley. The four brothers signed the deed for the sale of 75 acres of Benjamin Warrick's land Dec. 26, 1826.

Job Warrick married three times and his wives are thought to be sisters: Nancy, Sallie and Clarissa Brown.

This reunion you spoke of in your letter is the first one we've heard of for Warrick's. Don't know if we — Shirley and I, will be able to be there. So I was wondering if we could send a donation to receive this newspaper you spoke of.

Went to a graduation lately of 28 people to find a Tom Powell Warrick, Jr. graduating. His address is 7115 Hillshine Drive. Didn't know what connection he might be, if any, besides the ones The Woodley W's found out that are in the area.

Josiah Warrick, my great great grandfather was born Aug. 6, 1826, in Sampson County, North Carolina, and died Oct. 31, 1864, after being a prisoner of The Union Army. He is buried in the Hampton National Cemetery. He married Eliza Oats of North Carolina. Records show that she filed for widow's relief on March 12, 1896 in Crenshaw County, al. Josiah's children were: (1) Nancy b ca 1849, (2) S. Daniel Oats b ca 1850, (3) Mattie b ca 1853, (4) William C. b ca 1856, Crenshaw Co., al., (5) Wiley W. b ca 1857, Crenshaw Co., and (6) Bethiner b ca 1860.

William C. Warrick, my great grandfather m (1) Katie J. Fleming on Nov. 24, 1879 and (2) Mary T. Warner Aug 9, 1895. William C's children were (1) George Edward b June 1881, Crenshaw Co., (2) Stephen b Jan 1886, and (3) Jesse b Feb. 1888.

George Edward Warrick was my grandfather. He m Eula Wilks 24 June 1908 in Crenshaw County and d Mar 17, 1957. His children were: (1) George Wilks Warrick, b April 17, 1909, married Margaret Oaten in Chicago, Illinois. Their children were: Carol Ann b Oct 1, 1938 and Robert Wilks, b August 31, 1942. George Edward's other child was my father, William Donal Warrick, b. No 2, 1911, d July 21, 1980. He married Alice Athelene Royston on Oct. 14, 1939, at Oak Park, Illinois. My sister Shirley was b Jan 6, 1947 and married (now divorced) June 2, 1973, Richard Harold Williams in Birmingham, Alabama. I was born Nancy "Sarge" Royston, Dec. 31, 1949.

George E., my grandad was a piano dealer in Birmingham, never knew my grandmother Eula for she died prior to 1949. Both George Wilks and William D. were doctors in Birmingham.

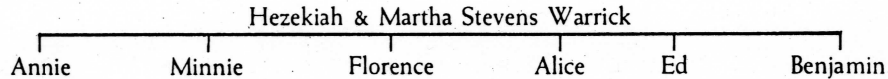

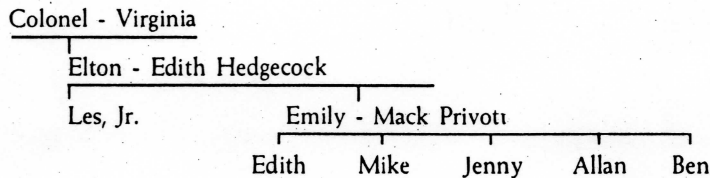
Minnie Married Jim Watson. They had no children. She died when fairly young. They farmed in Pine Level.

Florence Married Norman Hood and two children: Millard and Essie. They farmed in Swansboro.

Alice Married Walter Hightower and had two children: Viola and Willie. They farmed in Wayne County.

Ed Granddaddy can't remember his wife's name but remembers she dipped snuff! He was a contractor in Goldsboro. They had four children: Archie was a plumber, William was an electrician, Fred was a druggist, and Grace. Grace is still living.

Benjamin Called Colonel. Married Virginia Clifton. They had one child, Lesley Elton. Colonel owned and operated Warrick's Bar-B-Q Stand in Goldsboro.



Granddaddy thinks all of his aunts and uncles died from T.B. His dad died of kidney disease.

Job Warrick, Jr., Born 1-23-1837, married Margaret Ann Britt, Born 11-6-1836, on January 14, 1864.

Job and Margaret Ann Warrick had one son who lived to an adult age. Other children born to this couple died in early childhood or at birth. This couple's only son:

George Moses Warrick, Born 4-22-1867, Died 10-24-1951.

George Moses Warrick married Elizabeth (Betty) Pherobe Westbrook (Born 6-15-1870, Died 10-19, 1901) of Newton Grove, N.C. on March 23, 1892.

Children of George and Betty Warrick:

Henry Eldridge Warrick Born 1-13-1894, Died 8-5-1895.

Clarence Westbrook Warrick Born 9-8-1894, Died 4-28, 1982.

Luby Albert Warrick Born 2-3-1898, Died 3-1-1960.

George Moses Warrick married Valeria Williams Austin after the death of Elizabeth (Betty) Pherobe Westbrook. There were no children from this marriage.

George Warrick was a farmer, miller, and merchant in the Grantham Community of Wayne County. He was an active leader in building Grantham School, and serve on the Wayne County Board of Commissioners. He and his family were active members of the Falling Creek Baptist Church.

Clarence Westbrook Warrick, son of George Moses Warrick and Elizabeth (Betty) Pherobe Westbrook, was born in the Grantham Community in Wayne County on Sept. 8, 1894.

He was graduated from Falling Creek High School in Wayne County in 1912, and attended Wake Forest College for a year.

He returned to the family farm and helped operate it for three years before returning to college. He was graduated from N.C. State College, now North Carolina State University in Raleigh, in 1920.



For twelve years, Clarence Warrick taught vocational agriculture in Wayne, Person, Sampson, and Harnett Counties.

In 1934, he began a career with the U.S. Soil Conservation Service with an office in Lillington, N.C. In 1940, he was transferred to Johnston County for twenty-one years. He retired at age 66 in 1962.

Clarence Warrick was an active member of his community and church. He served many terms as a deacon in the First Baptist Church in Smithfield. He was a member of the Smithfield Kiwanis Club and the Masonic Lodge in Pikeville.

Until his death he was most interested in his farming operations in the Grantham Community in Wayne County.

After a period of declining health, Clarence Warrick died on April 28, 1982. He is survived by his wife, Margaret Barrett Warrick; one son, C. W. Warrick, Jr. of Pascagoula, Mississippi; three daughters, Elizabeth Harper of Laurinburg, Mary Jane Brannan of Smithfield, Barrett Tharrington of Virginia Beach, Virginia; and five grandchildren.

After service in the Civil War, he m Mary Virginia Wise, dau of John Wise on 13 Jan 1870. Their children were:

1. Josiah "Joe" S. Warrick, b 27 June 1871 d in 1927, m Lula Edwards. He was the Goldsboro tax collector when he died.
2. Anna Warrick, b 22 June 1874, d 10 May 1910 m Henry Dunbar.
