NEWS OF LEWIS WARRICK DESCENDANTS

(4th Son of Job Warrick, Sr.)

I, James Howard Warrick, Sr. am the great great grandson of Job Sr. and Nancy Warrick. My great grandfather Lewis b 10 Apr 1828 d 26 May 1905, fourth child of Job and Nancy, married Mary Liser b 1831 d 14 Oct 1884, in 1857 in Pike County, Alabama. They had three sons, Benjamin b 14 Aug 1858 d 10 Feb 1915, Wiley b 26 Sep 1860 d 1 Mar 1927, and Sidney b 10 Apr 1866 d 21 Apr 1938. All three sons were born in Pike County, Alabama. Wiley and Sidney later moved to Houston County, AL, near Dothan.

Benjamin never married. In 1883 it was alleged that he killed a man named Lee at Brundidge in Pike County, AL where he lived. He was tried, convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment. Shortly after the trial he escaped from the Pike County jail and went to North Carolina where upon his death he was buried in the Falling Creek Methodist Church Cemetery, Wayne County, NC. It was said that public opinion was strongly in favor of Benjamin and one of the largest petitions for parden ever gotten up in Pike County, a petition signed by the presiding judge, solicitor and jury were ready for presentation to the governor, but Benjamin was

not then in the custody of the State, hence a pardon could not be granted. It was said that there probably would not have been a governor of the State who would not have pardoned Benjamin, if he had only returned to the State and surrendered to the authorities. This he would never consent to do, preferring to remain in North Carolina, where he was a prosperous citizen. No effort was ever made by the Alabama authorities to bring him back. It was said and it was the universal belief that he was justifiable in killing the man, Lee.

My grandfather Wiley, the second son of Lewis and Mary Liser, married Laura Pierce b 20 Sep 1865 d 28 Jun 1952, about 1886 or 1887 in Pike County, AL. They had six children, three sons, Luther b 18 Aug 1888 d 18 Mar 1933, Pat b 3 Jul 1890 d 16 Mar 1937, Alto b 18 Apr 1892 (still living) and three daughters, Vera b 20 Mar 1894 (still living), Eula Mae b 21 Nov. 1897 (still living), and Julia b 21 Oct 1902 d Apr 1976.

My father, Pat, the second son of Wiley and Laura Pierce, married my mother, Pearl Eddins b 8 Aug 1892 d 8 May 1981, in Houston County, AL on 17 May 1913. They had four children, one son (myself) James Howard Warrick b 5 Feb 1915, and three daughters, Helen b 5 Jan 1917, Mildred b 15 Jan 1920, and Annette b 31 Jan 1927.

My wife, Isabelle Burt, b13 Jun 1914 d12 May 1966, and I were married 20 Jul 1940 in Nashville, TN. She gave me two sons, James Howard, Jr. b 2 Sep 1943 in Nashville, TN and Thomas Patrick b 24 Dec 1944 in Camp Lejeune, NC. I served in the United States Marine Corps from 28 May 1934 to 1 Oct.

1956 and retired as a Warrant Officer. For the majority of my time in the Marines I was an auditor. After that I was employed by the Marine Corps Post Exchange System for 20 years as an accountant and retired again in 1976 as Assistant Director of the Marine Corps Post Exchange System. I am a Mason.

My oldest son, James Howard, Jr. is a Certified Public Accountant. He graduated from J.E.B. Stuart High School, Falls Church, VA with honors, then went to Strayer Junior College in Washington, D.C. for two years and graduated with honors. When he took his CPA exam, he was in the top 14 in the United States in achievement on the exam. He is a senior partner in a CPA firm in Washington,

D.C. His marriage to Genevieve Bruce on 29 Jun 1963 in Falls Church, VA ended in divorce. However, they have two sons, Jeffrey Bruce Warrick b 25 Aug 1965 and Terry James Warrick b 16 June 1967. His son, Jeffrey Bruce, graduated from Falls Church High School on 2 Jun 1983 with honors. He is a member of the National Honor Society and is going to Old Dominion University in the fall. My oldest son, James Howard, Jr. married Shirley Ann Alberti in Pittsburgh, PA on 1 Sep 1974 and they have one son, Joshua, b 15 Sep 1978.

My youngest son, Thomas Patrick, married Holly Williams on 5 Jun 1966. Their two children are Thomas Patrick, Jr. b 19 Jan 1969 and Patricia Ann, b 7 May 1971. This marriage ended in divorce, however, my son has custody of the two children and the three of them live with me. Thomas Patrick, Sr. is employed by Fairfax County, VA as an automotive mechanic.

My sister, Helen, never married. She is retired from Civil Service and now lives in Mesa, AZ. Helen worked as Editor at the Central Intelligence Agency. She is a member of the American Newspaper Women's Club and has been listed in Who's Who of American Women. My sister, Annette, was married for a short time but is now divorced. She is a retired registered nurse and also lives in Mesa, AZ. Annette attended the University of Alabama and George Washington University. She received a BS in nursing and Master of Science in nursing and minor in psychology at the Catholic University, was elected to honorary society, Sigma Theta Tau and is a member of American Association of University Women. My sister, Mildred, married Earl Edison Musgrove on 24 Dec. 1942. They have two children, Carol Ann, b 24 Sep 1946 and Roger Earl, b 15 Aug 1951. Carol's marriage ended in divorce, however, she has two sons, Alan Everhart, b 11 May 1967 and Jeffrey William Everhart, b 13 July 1971. They live in California. Roger married Susan Patricia Upp, on 22 Aug 1970 and they have two children: Bryant Edison, b 28 Apr 1979 and Elizabeth Dispeaux, b 2 Mar 1983. They live in California and both are school teachers. Mildred's husband, Earl, is a retired Army Major and they live in Mesa, AZ.

My great grandparents, Lewis and Mary Liser Warrick are buried in the Baptist Rest Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery just south of Brundidge, AL. My grandparents, Wiley and Laura Pierce Warrick are buried in the City Cemetery in Dothan, AL. My father, Pat Warrick, is also buried in the City Cemetery, Dothan, AL. My mother, Pearl Eddins Warrick, came to the Washington, D.C. area with my sisters during World War II and insisted on being buried here, so she is in Memorial Park, Falls Church, VA. My wife, Isabelle Burt Warrick, is buried in Arlington National Cemetery where I will also rest some day.

My great grandfather Lewis was a farmer as was my grandfather Wiley. My father, Pat, had various jobs, including serving as a City Policeman for three years, but at the time of his early death he was in the livestock business. He bought cattle and hogs out in the country and could guess within five pounds how much they weighed on the hoof. My father also managed my grandfather's farm for a number of years. He was born in Brundidge, AL and moved to Dothan, AL in childhood with his family. He was an active Mason and also was a member of the Woodmen of the World and was affiliated with the Beulah Baptist Church near Dothan, AL. All of the family were Baptist. However, my wife was Methodist so I became a Methodist. My sister, Helen, was secretary of the First Baptist Church in Dothan, AL, for several years before she went to Washington, D.C. to work in Civil Service.

My father's brother, Luther Warrick, married Oline Ingram (deceased). They had three children, Hazel, Luther, Jr. and James Edward. Uncle Luther had the Ford Motor Co. agency in Blakely, GA and was quite successful selling Model T and Model A Fords until his early death.

My father's brother, Alto, married Ruth George, b 29 Mar 1898 d 24 Oct 1977. They had one son, George, b 17 Apr 1921. Uncle Alto also lives in Blakely, GA. In his early days he was a locksmith and had the Dodge Auto agency for a while until he opened a retail store, which his son, George, now operates with his wife, Roanie and his son, Al.

My father's sister, Vera, married J. Robert Gwaltney (deceased) and they had three children, Frank, Mary Evelyn, and Francis. His sister, Eula Mae married Jasper R. McArthur (deceased). They had two daughters, Dorothy and Virginia (deceased). His sister, Julia, married C.P. Hicks (deceased). They had one adopted daughter, Thelma (deceased).

With the exception of a slipped disc in 1980, the only bit of news I have about myself is that I attended the 50th Reunion of my High School Class in Dothan, AL on May 13-14, 1983. We had 67 in our class when we graduated in 1933 during the Great Depression. At the reunion 36 classmates attended. At the big dinner, the night of the 14th, there were 63 people present, including two of our teachers. I gave each classmate and the teachers an address/telephone book imprinted on the cover "Dothan High School, 50th Class Reunion, 1933-1983, Dothan, Alabama." A photo of the old high school building was used as a guide to decorate a huge cake for the reunion. A United States flag, which was flown over the U.S. Capitol on March 29, 1983, was presented by one of the classmates to the County Commission Chairman. This flag will be flown over the Houston-Love Memorial Library, which is our old High School building. Because of the Great Depression, we couldn't afford anything such as a yearbook or photograph, but we did get our diplomas. Some of the classmates came from as far away as Nassau, Denver and Phoenix. Needless to say we all had a great time and plan to meet each year hereafter as long as we may live.

DEATH OF AN OLD SOLDIER

Last week we wrote, from memoranda given us, an account of the Death of Old Comrade Lewis Warrick, (generally known as "Pap") which had just occurred at the residence of his son near Dothan. But the article wa lost after being given to the printers, and the notes were not preserved. So we are left to memory in saying that Comrade Warrick was born in North Carolina about 80 years ago. He lived in Henry and Pike Counties, in this state, for many years. A few years since he came to the home of a son near Dothan, and there he met the last enemy. Comrade Warrick was a member of the 39th Alabama Infantry in the Confederate Army, serving in Tennessee. As a soldier, he was widely known throughout his command for bravery, punctuality to duty, and a fatherly kindness which made the soldier life less hard for many a sick or wounded comrade. This latter quality gained for him the title of "Pap" and he bore it till his death. He had long been a Baptist, and died in that faith.

Farewell, old Comrade! The battle is still going on with some of us. But we will answer at roll call bye and bye.

Ludie Warrick Pritchard is Sudie Warrick Sanford's younger sister. They are daughters of Lewis Warrick, born 27 November 1956, and Sally Jane Hudson, born 29 December 1868. Lewis Warrick was son of William Henry Warrick, 5th child of Job Warrick, Sr.

Lewis and Sally Jane (Hudson) Warrick had 9 children:

EZEKIAL WARRICK (12th Child of Job Warrick, Sr.)

Letter from Hazel Gwaltney, granddaughter of Ezekial and Carolina (Tarver) Warrick.

Dear Mary & Woodley,

It was good to hear from you again. We think of you often and it would be nice to see you again. The door is always open to you to visit us whenever you can.

You really gave me a "big order" for this family newsletter, Woodley! I'm not sure I can tell you much you don't already know. Feel free to cut out anything that is not needed. When it comes right down to putting it in black and white, I know very little about my Grandpa and Grandma Warrick. Mother didn't know much about their backgrounds herself, and of course they were both dead long before I came on the scene.

Ezekial Warrick, 12th child of Job Warrick, Sr. and his wife Sallie, was born 19 November 1842 in Wayne Co., NC. He enlisted in the army on 14 November 1861 at Goldsboro, NC, was a private in Co. A, 27th N.C. Regiment, wounded at Bristol Ctation, Virginia and discharged 14 November 1863. Mother said he always walked ith a limp (war wound) and used a cane. After the war he moved to Pike County, Alabama. There he married Caroline Elizabeth Tarver on 12 January 1873 at Troy, Alabama. He made his living by farming. He was known around Tarentum, Alabama where he lived as "Uncle Zeke" and one who could grow the best sweet potatoes around and they were always in demand.

There were 9 children of Ezekial and Caroline Warrick: (1) Virginia born 13 Nov. 1874 died 1963. She never married. (2) Ida born 24 Nov. 1876 died 27 June 1952 married Charlie French and had 3 sons Tarver, Cyril and Lehman French. (3) William Marion born 7 May 1879 died 18 April 1906. He never married. (4) James G. born 2 July 1881 died ? married Ida Goodson and had one daughter Alberta. (5) Lilla Pearl born 5 Nov. 1883 died 29 July 1885, never married. (6) Walter born

27 Nov. 1886 died? married Barnette Bearfield and had one daughter, Elizabeth. (7) Berthan born 17 September 1891 died? married Mance Dickens, and had 1 son and 4 daughters: Frank, Mary, Gertrude, Barnette and Annell Dickens. (8) Jesse born 9 November 1895 died 1962 married Nell Cogdill and had one daughter Carolyn Warrick. (9) Bernice born 8 March 1898 died 8 June 1980 married Alvin W. Gwaltney.

My mother, Bernice, was the 9th child of Ezekial and Caroline (Tarver) Warrick, who married Alvin W. Gwaltney. I really don't know the names nor number of all my first cousins but I can tell you about my own immediate family.

On September 16, 1983, we had a call from Milton Loraine Warrick of Dallas, Texas telling us of a very unfortunate incident in his life. In March 1980 he went to the hospital for a fairly common operation, to have his gall bladder removed. Strangely, the doctor gave him a shot which paralized him from head to foot. He was hospitalized, often near death, for 11 months. It was this call from a very warm and friendly relative that prompted our trip to Dallas, Texas. In addition to his illness, he had lost his wife, mother and father since his visit to our home.

We had met Milton when he visited us in Raleigh in 1976 while on a business trip to Mount Airy, North Carolina. His interest in visiting us was to learn if we knew of his great grandfather, Thomas Warrick, and where he might be buried. At that time we did not know. A little later on we did learn that Wiley Warrick, brother of our Job Warrick, Sr. and Josiah Warrick, 3rd child and son of our Job Warrick, Sr. were listed in Coosa County, Alabama (just north of Montgomery) in the 1850 Census. Wiley Warrick had a son named Thomas, Thomas had a son named Marcus, Marcus had a son named Anderson Marcus who was the father of Milton Warrick.

It was interesting the way Milton got our address. In 1973 while on a cross-country trip, Mary signed the visitor register at the Lyndon Johnson Library in Austin, Texas. A man nearby noticed the name Warrick and told her he knew of a Warrick couple in Waco, Texas who were elderly and with whom he visited and carried reading material from his church. He suggested that they might appreciate a visit or letter from a N.C. Warrick. Upon returning home, Mary wrote to the couple, A. M. Warrick and wife. About a year or more later their son, Milton, picked up the letter and called with questions relating to his Warrick ancestors.

We made it a leisurely trip, stopping in Coosa County and Elmore County, Alabama to search the Warrick line. We attended the very lovely wedding and reception, afterwhich we had dinner at the home of John Bailey, Sr. and wife Jean Woodham Bailey. It was an enjoyable occasion with many of the Bailey relatives.

On March 6th, we left Mobile and stopped at a station near Pascagoula, called C. W. Warrick, Jr. (son of Margaret and Clarence Warrick, deceased of Smithfield) and asked that we visit their church with them as well as have Sunday lunch together. It turned our picture perfect with visiting his beautiful family, wife Romona, daughter Jane and son Jim.

That night we stayed in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and spent the next morning touring the 34 story Capitol building, built in 1932, and also the Baton Rouge downtown area.

LESLIE ELTON WARRICK, SR.

Goldsboro, North Carolina — Elton Warrick, 81, Goldsboro civic leader, died 22 July 1983. He was born in Goldsboro, 28 January 1902 the only child of Benjamin Ashley "Colonel" Warrick and Virginia Josephine "Jennie" Clifton Jackson. The widower of Edith Moore Hedgecock, he is survived by a son and daughter: L. E. Warrick, Jr., and Emily V. Privott and 5 grandchildren, Edith Lynn Privott of Thomasville, Michael Privott of Greensboro, Virginia Privott and Benjamin Privott of Goldsboro. Also surviving is his housekeeper of 44 years, Penina Smith of the home.

Elton taught and coached football at Sanford, winning State championship for two years. After teaching at Rocky Mount, Smith Chapel, Mt. Olive and Brogden, he became a building contractor.

He was former president of the Rotary Club, former chairman of the Wayne County Wolfpack Club and former president of the Guilford College Alumni Association. He also was a director of Goldsboro Savings and Loan for 35 years, as well as a member of the Salvation Army Advisory Board for 25 years.

Elton Warrick attended Goldsboro public schools. In 1925, he was captain of the Guilford College football team. He was also president of Goldsboro's last professional baseball team, the "Goldsboro Jets". He was a noted after dinner speaker.

Although widely known as a civic leader, his most honorable characteristic was his generosity. He was known to have given to many people and was especially recognized for his financial aids to many young men and women so that they could attend college.

His father, "Colonel" Warrick moved to Goldsboro in 1896 and opened Goldsboro's first restaurant which he operated for 27 years. Elton's grandfather was Hezekiah Warrick, son of Job Warrick, Sr.
