## JOB WARRICK



Job Warrick 1798-1879

Job Warrick, for whom this newsletter is named, was born in Va. according to the 1840 U.S. Census. He was born Nov. 18, 1798, to Benjamin and Sallie Warrick. Benjamin died in 1803 and his wife sold her dower rights to his real estate in Northampton County, NC, to Job Warrick. It seems likely that this Job and Benjamin were brothers. This same Job sold 86 acres in 1802, which was the Granville grant made to a Job Warrick in 1757. The northern boundary of this land was the Virginia State line. By 1772, Job, who received the land grant had died. We know this because land sold adjoining the land grant was described as adjoining the land of the heirs of Job Warrick.

Jacob Warrick of Brunswick County, Va., purchased a tract of land in 1746 that lay in Brunswick County, Va. and Northampton County, NC. Benjamin Warrick witnessed this deed. This Benjamin also purchased land in Northampton County in 1751.

Three Warricks were in Northampton County, NC prior to 1755, Jacob, Benjamin and Job. Were they father and sons, brothers, or even related? Did they immigrate to Va. or were they born in America? We are still searching for the answer to these questions. We know there were Warricks in Virginia in the 1600's.

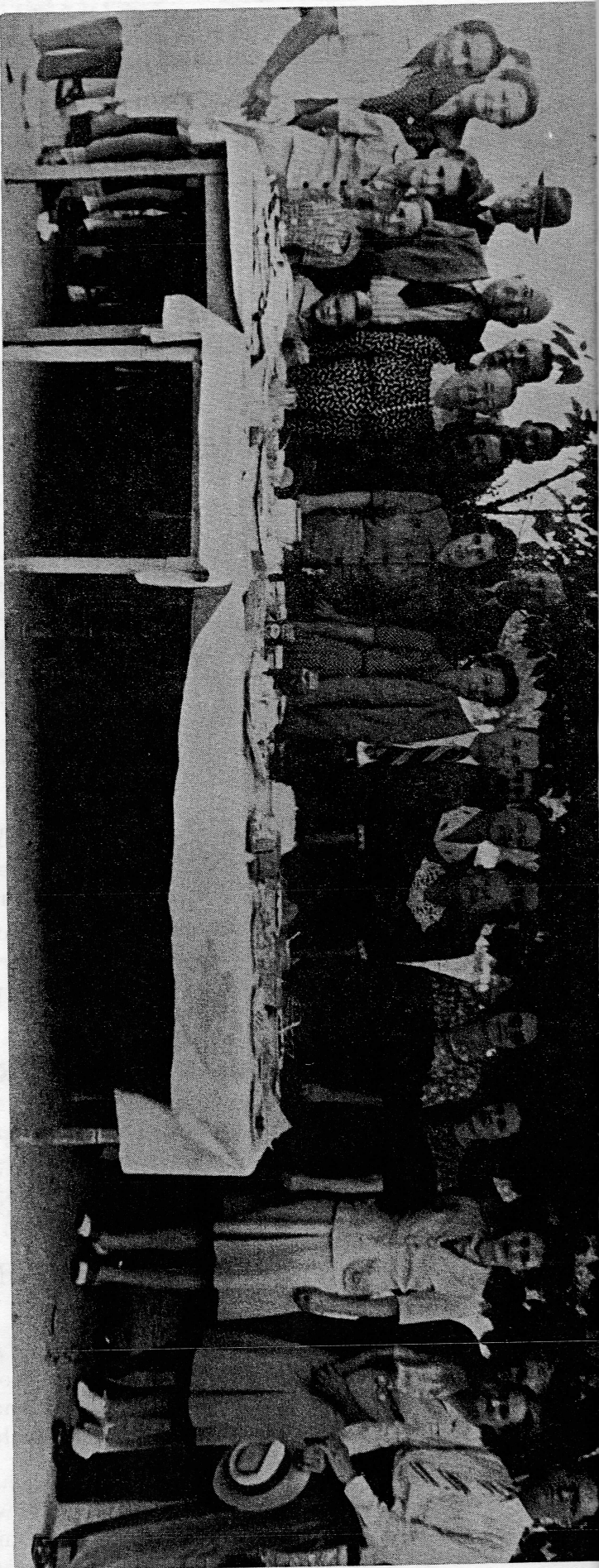
## WARRICK REUNION

## LETTERS WITH INFORMATION ON THE FAMILY OF WILEY WARRICK, Brother of Job Warrick Sr.

Letter No. 1

Dear Mr. Warrick,

I was so glad to find someone who knew about my Warrick family. I have written to several working on Warrick's, but they all come back with, sorry I don't know anything about your particular line. I was beginning to think that they came out of nowhere and then disappeared again.

Mary Jane Warrick, dau. of Jobs brother Wiley, married John Wesley Brown in Coosa County, Ala. They had four boys. John Henry, b 1862; Thomas Elzy, b 1866; James Wiley, b 1868; and Barbacus, b 1870. Evidently, Mary died shortly after the last child was born. The 1880 U.S. Census shows John Wesley Brown and his boys living with the Warricks. Barbacus doesn't show up on a later census and no one in my family has ever heard of him, so I'm guessing something happened to him and he died.

Mary Jane's brother, Thomas Warrick, was living in 1860 in a community called Central, Ala. The rest of the Warricks were in a community about 8 miles northeast of Wetumpka, Ala., on Hwy 14, called Pleasant Hill. A lot of my Brown family are buried there. I don't know if the Warrick's are buried there.

Mary Jane Warrick Brown had two sisters, Georgia Ann and Elizabeth, that never married. In 1900 they were still living at the old home place with their nephew, James Brown, son of Mary Jane. Their oldest brother John W. Warrick, son of Wiley Warrick, Job's brother, also never married and took care of the two old maid sisters until he died in 1898. He left the home place to the sisters and asked James Brown to live with them and take care of them until their death. The house is still standing but I have no idea who owns it now. I haven't found any Warricks left in the area.

I was glad to learn where Wiley Warrick came from. You live in the perfect place to check out the NC records.

It looks like Wiley's father died very soon after his birth. If they sold the land in 1825, in Northampton County, NC, where did they go until they came to Ala.? Were they in Ga.?

Thank you for your help. Let me know if you find anything new on Benjamin Warrick. I will look up anything I can for you if you need me to.

There are quite a few Warricks in Pike County, Ala. Are they related? I have talked to some of them on the phone.

**(Editor's Note:** Wiley Warrick [brother of Job, Sr.] was listed in the 1850 U.S. Census living with wife, Catherine, in Coosa County, Ala. The 1860 census showed Catherine living with their oldest son, John W. Warrick. Wiley and Catherine's children listed in the 1950 census were: Thomas - 17, Tempe - 15, Mary - 13, Josephene - 6, Georgia - 4, and Elizabeth - 2.)

Mary Jane Warrick was married 6-4-1861 Coosa County, Ala. to John Wesley Brown. Their children were: John Henry, Thomas Elzy, James Wiley and Barbacus.

John Henry Brown, b 5-28-1862, d 10-24-1938, md (1) Lula Rowe, 10-28-1886 Elmore County (2) Balzoar Webb Dupree 5-16-1901 Chilton County. Children by Lula were: Noah, Edie, Brady, and Lonnie. Children by Balzoar were: Sarah Elizabeth, Zebidee, Woodrow and Charlie.

Zebidee Brown, b 8-4-1906, d 7-1-1973 md, Viola Hellums, b 1-17-1910, still living md 2-8-1928 Elmore County. Children were: Agnes Lee, Eunice, Mary Frances, John Wilson, James Wiley, Dorothy Jean, Joseph Edward, and Laura Faye.

Mary Frances Brown, b 12-31-31, still living, married Clarence William Hall, 11-11-1949 in Coosa County. Children were: Frances Elaine, b 11-27-1950, and Clarence Lee Brown, b 8-22-1955.

Frances Elaine Hall married Jeffery Hendricks 12-21-1968 in Montgomery County. Children are: Kelly Elizabeth, b 10-9-1975 and Jeffery David, b 10-31-1982.

Lewis Sidney Warrick, son of Lewis, and grandson of Job Warrick was born 10 Apr 1866. He married first, Susan Helm of Brandidge, Ala. in the late 1880's. They had five children, three boys and two girls. The oldest, Mamie Ethel Warrick, married Wm. Arthur Pittman and they lived in Bainbridge, Ga. Both are deceased. Next born was Robert Young Warrick who married Betty Lou Bond and they lived in Panama City, Fla. He died 1 Sept 1937 and she died 21 July 1938. Lillie Mae Warrick was the third born. She married Brady Morgan Woodham and they lived in Dothan, Ala. Both are deceased, she having died 15 Sept 1941 at 46. Harry Martin Warrick was the fourth child of Lewis Sidney. He married Annie \_\_\_\_\_ and they lived at Bainbridge Ga. Harry died, 10 Sept 1935, at the age of 37. Lewis Bascomb Warrick, the last born to Lewis Sidney and Susan Helm, married Christine Everidge and lived in Dothan. He died 10 May 1954 at 53. Christine has married again and lives in the northeastern U.S. (**Editor's Note:** Sylvia told me in Mobile that her mother lives in Greensboro, NC.)

Mamie and Arthur Pittman's children were: Charles, Margaret, Dorothy, Louie, and Edward. Louie and Edward died early in life. Dorothy married a Powell and lived in Brinson, Ga., in 1937. Robert Young Warrick and Betty Lou had no children. Lillie Mae and Brady Woodham had one daughter, Betty Jean, who married John Bailey, Sr., now living in Mobile, Ala. (**Editor's Note:** Dr. John Bailey, son of John and Betty Jean attended the Warrick Reunion at Johnston Union Church several year ago.) Harry and Annie Warrick had one daughter, Virginia. She married Charlie Kinsey and they now live in Jacksonville, Fla. (I believe he is dead now.) Bascomb and Christine's children are Heywood Warrick of Largo, Fla.; Sylvia Sidney who married James Norman Spann, now living in Mobile; Susan Carol, who married Edward Mason; and Cynthia, born in 1948.

A few years after the death of Susan Helm Warrick, Lewis Sidney Warrick married Samantha Elizabeth Patterson on 17 July 1917. They lived in Dothan, Ala. They had one daughter, Mary Sue, born 3 Feb 1919. Lewis Sidney Warrick died 21 April 1938 and Elizabeth P. Warrick died 17 April 1979. Both are buried in Dothan City Cemetery.

Mary Sue Warrick, married Otis N. Hinson of Chipley, Fla. on 22 Oct 1950. They still live in Chipley. Their son, Sidney W. Hinson, b 12 July 1954, married Linda Ferguson. He is a supervisor for Oyler Bros. Landscaping Co. in Orlando. Their daughter, Elizabeth Ann Hinson, b 12 Sept. 1956, lives in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. and is a counselor with HRS for the state of Fla. 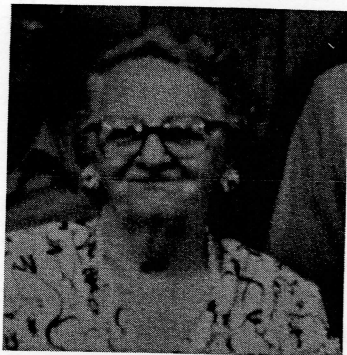

## WE SALUTE FLOSSIE GAYLOR, THE OLDEST LIVING RELATIVE OF COUNCIL WARRICK

There was plenty of warmth and friendliness in the family room when we visited her on 4 January 1984. The weather had begun to turn warmer after the coldest December on record. Flossie seemed to be glowing with good health particularly for her age. She is the oldest living descendent of Council and Martha Underwood Warrick. She was 84 on Apr. 26, 1984.

On that afternoon she related to us something of her past. She was born to Dora Warrick 26 Apr 1900 and they lived with her grandparents, Council and Martha. On June 30, 1906 Dora married Charlie Crocker. They had a daughter, Alice Pearl, b Mar. 1, 1908. Dora was found dead with her baby daughter on Mar. 19, 1908. Alice then lived with her father and his family, but died 28 Nov 1914, and is buried in the Crocker Cemetery at Pine Level.

Flossie lived with Council until Martha's death Apr. 9, 1908. She said that Grandpa Council was a great influence in her life. In her words he was a good man, an old-timey type person, with



not a selfish bone in his body. To her knowledge he never abused her, but in fact, was very good to her. He was a bit quick tempered and a little outspoken when disturbed but never a "rough" man.

She remembered Grandma Martha as not being tall and in a way a little chubby. Flossie said Martha was as good as gold, easy going, and one who stayed at home and "looked after" her children and grandchildren. She never "raised her voice."

Flossie remembers her grandparents living near Nath Wiggs and Van Oliver on what is now SR 2323 near Princeton. She said Council was a good carpenter and could build anything. He built a house for Van Oliver which stands today. He also built for his daughter, Fannie and husband Kade Lane a house which also stands today.

After Grandma Martha died of typhoid fever in 1908, Council married Bashie Braswell who had a house full of boys and 2 girls. Aunt Net Stuckey wouldn't stand for Flossie to live with this family, so afterwards she lived with Aunt Net for about 6 years and then with Uncle Charlie Warrick and Aunt Jessie.

Aunt Net and Uncle Fred Stuckey lived on the Boykin place near Rains Cross Roads when Flossie lived with them. She attended church there with Net and Fred and they walked a plank across Spring Branch to get to the church. She became a Christian and joined Rains Cross Road Free Will Baptist Church at 11 years old and has attended this same church ever since.

When Flossie was 14 or 15 she went to live with her uncle Charlie and Aunt Jessie. She said Charlie was a real sport, good looking and "high falutin'." He drove a nice horse and buggy and often played the mandelin at local gatherings.

Flossie's education may have been higher than that of her peers. Her first year of school was at Massey School adjacent to Bizzell Grove Church and her first grade teacher was Malissa Boyette. One of her classmates was Zilphia Oliver, sister of Raeford Oliver now of Smithfield and past well known clothing store owner and was sheriff for many years. Her next school was Carter which was between Rains Cross Roads and Kenly. She attended eighth grade at Princeton, NC.

Much of her life revolved around Rains Cross Roads Church. She attended Sunday School in the afternoon there and that's where she met Lonnie Gaylor. They were married Mar. 30, 1918. Lonnie soon was drafted by the military, but was not away too long.

Lonnie and Flossie were farmers. She said he always elected to rent rather than to buy a farm. They farmed and reared their children in the northeastern part of Johnston County. Lonnie died Feb. 22, 1962 and very soon afterwards Flossie had opportunity to purchase a home in Micro where she now lives. Her son, Billy lives with her. We will always remember her for her goodness and her pleasant smile and warm personality.

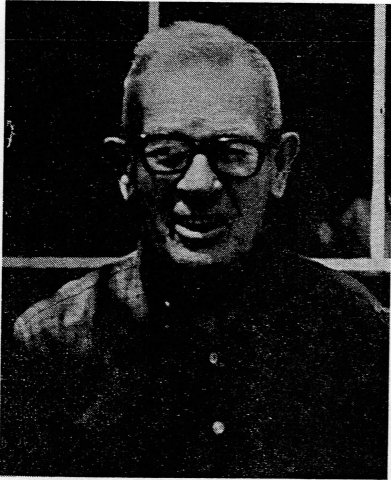

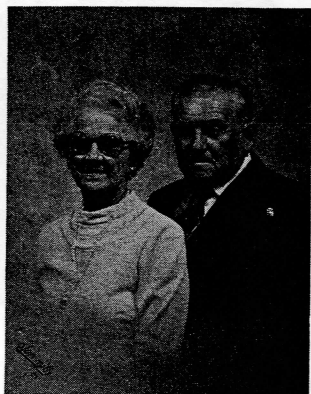
