MINUTES OF JOB WARRICK, SR. MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

The Job Warrick, Sr. Memorial Committee (21 people) met on Sunday, 11 November 1984 at the Copper Kettle Restaurant, MGN Regency Motel, Goldsboro, North Carolina.

After a good lunch, Woodley C. Warrick, Acting-Chairman, called the meeting to order. Each person was asked to give his relationship to Job Warrick, Sr. and to relate some of his personal family history.

The next item of business was the election of officers. Elected were: Chairman, Woodley C. Warrick; Vice-Chairman, L. E. (Les) Warrick, Jr.; Secretary-Treasurer, Mary W. Warrick.

The Chairman stated the main purpose of the meeting was to discuss placing a memorial at the grave of Job Warrick, Sr. as well as the maintenance of the graveyard. One option discussed was to have the remains moved to Falling Creek Baptist Church cemetery at Grantham with an appropriate marker. It was concluded that we should know more about the cost of moving the grave as well as the practicability of doing so. Also we needed to know the thinking of the Brown family relatives on moving the grave. Most of the people buried in the Job Warrick, Sr. homeplace cemetery were relatives of Job Warrick, Sr.'s third wife, Clarsey Brown Warrick. Another option was to place a memorial of reasonable size at the grave and a smaller marker in the Warrick plot at Falling Creek Baptist Church cemetery. A perpetual care fund was also discussed.

Three people were selected: Les Warrick, Morris Warrick and Woodley Warrick to investigate the above suggestion and to make a proposal to the members of this committee. Meeting adjourned.

On 17 December 1984, letters were mailed to the Job Warrick, Sr. Memorial Committee from Woodley Warrick, Chairman. He stated that Les Warrick, Morris Warrick and Woodley Warrick had made their study as requested. They reported (1) it is impractical to move a grave this old, (2) that maintaining the cemetery or preventing encroachment by their plow cannot be guaranteed even though N.C. law states that such is illegal, (3) that a fund be set up with trustee being replaced as necessary is the surest way to proceed in maintaining the graveyard, and (4) that a marker be placed in the Warrick plot at Falling Creek Baptist Church.

Based on the above finding, they proposed: 1. A suitable memorial (minimum cost about \$400.00) be placed at the present grave. 2. Marker be placed at Falling Creek Church graveyard. 3. Committee members contact their relatives and inform them of the project so they might have the privilege of contributing. 4. Contributions received from Warrick descendants would be spent on the Memorial and the balance remaining to be placed in Perpetual Care Fund with trustee to be appointed and being replaced as necessary.

On 1 August 1985, they selected and placed an order with McLamb Monument Co., P.O. Box 143, Goldsboro, N.C. for the Job Warrick, Sr. Memorial, at a cost of \$438.90. Total contributions received for the Memorial Fund as of 10 August 1985 is \$1,020.00. Those who would like to contribute to this project but have not been contacted and had the privilege of doing so, may mail your contribution to Woodley C. We Salute Minnie McClenny Sutton
Granddaughter of Betsy Warrick Holloman
 by Woodley Warrick

On Sunday afternoon, August 4, Margaret Vinson McClenny of Rosewood, Wayne County, did us a great favor. She took us on a 3 mile trip from Rosewood and introduced us to the oldest living descendant of Job Warrick, Minnie McClenny Sutton. We also met several of her lovely daughters at that time. Her daughters take turns in caring for their mother at home.

Minnie McClenny Sutton will be 97 years old Dec. 5, 1985. Although she has a wheel chair, she is relatively healthy, very alert, and has a good memory. Cousin Minnie is the daughter of Sarah E. Holloman and James W. McClenny. She was born five miles from Grantham and between Corbett Hill and Dudley and attended public school from the first through the seventh grades at Union Academy located on the Amy Grantham Plantation. After 4 months of free school each year, her father and other men in the community hired a teacher for an extended school session paid for by families in the community at the rate of five cents per student per day.

After she finished the seventh grade she was ready for marriage and did marry, at the age of 15, Bernice Love Sutton of the Dudley area. Bernice was born 27 Sept. 1878 and died 18 May 1976 at the age of 98.

Cousin Minnie's siblings were John Williams McClenny who married Lisa Crow; Josephus who married Nannie Grantham, brother of Sid Grantham; Samuel Fox who married (1) Isabell Morgan and (2) Callie Wadsworth; Margaret Alice (Maggie) married Needham Crow, Metta Florence who married James Harrell; Daniel Sutton; and George A. who married (1) Nettie Hesse and (2) Emma Poythress. Cousin Minnie is the only one living of her family.

The Suttons lived in the neighborhood of her birth until about 1940 when they purchased a farm about 3 miles from Rosewood. They had no need by then for the large two story house in which they had reared their children. This couple was blessed with a house full of fine children. Thirteen was their lucky number.

Cousin Minnie has memories of times she visited some of her Warrick kin. She ate many times at the barbecue restaurant owned by Benjamin Ashley "Colonel" Warrick in Goldsboro. She also recalls visits to the Jimmy Warricks' home, of seeing Jasper and others of the family. She also remembers writing the Council Warrick family at the Rains Mill area. Job Warrick, Jr. was another relative she remembers seeing when she was a child. She also related to us some of the Civil War times when relatives told her about hiding food stuff from the Union soldiers. One relative had completely filled the space under his bed with corn to prevent confiscation of it by the enemy.

Nannie Underwood Grantham, sister of Council Warrick's wife, Martha, assisted Cousin Minnie in doctoring her sick children according to Cousin Minnie.

We hope we can hear more from this remarkable woman, Cousin Minnie Sutton.
