


Council C. Warrick was the son of Sallie Brown Warrick and Job Warrick, Sr. He was born in Wayne County, N.C., 29 June 1851, died 4 December 1920. He married 3 February 1876 Martha Grace Underwood, born 23 March 1849, died 9 April 1907, daughter of Benjamin Underwood and Barshaby (Bashie) Jordon Underwood of Sampson County, N.C. They were married by L. D. Summerlin, minister, and witnesses to the marriage were: J. L. Cobb, J. I. Rose, and Rufus Mozingo. Council commenced his family at Grantham, but moved to the Princeton or Boon Hill area about 1892. Both are buried in the Oliver Cemetery at the intersection of SR 2322 and SR 2323, west of Princeton, N.C. Council was known to have been a farmer and house builder, the Rayford Oliver homeplace near the Oliver Cemetery being one house extant that he built. Council was also known to have been free-hearted and like to joke a lot. His wife, Martha, is said to have been a very family oriented, stay-at-home type, gentle and warm person. Their children were: Fannie, Nettie, Dora, Lola, Charlie and Sallie.

outskirts of Dothan, Alabama, and went to school in Dothan. He quit school in about the ninth grade and went to work for a bicycle and motorcycle shop. He saved his money and built a motorcycle of used parts. When he accumulated \$500.00, he packed up and drove to Blakely, Ga. Blakely is the county seat of Early Co. and the courthouse is in the center of a square. There was a hotel on the east side of the square run by a Miss Emma McDonald and that s where Luther boarded.

He went to the First National Bank and persuaded the president to lend him \$5,000.00 to start a business which was to be a bicycle and motorcycle shop in what was formerly a post-office. The business prospered and several years

later, he rented another building and opened the first theater in Blakely. Luther operated it himself, with a girl to sell tickets and a black boy to clean up.

Next, Luther bought a Model T Ford and five or six acres in the northwest part of town and built a house on it. He then persuaded Miss Emma to leave the hotel and open a boarding house in the house he had built.

Miss Emma was my mother's cousin. While Miss Emma ran the hotel, Mother

came by train from Arlington, Ga., to visit her. It was then that Dad met and began courting my mother, Johnnie Oline Ingram. When they married, Miss Emma was running the boarding house at Dad's house. My parents boarded there until Miss Emma retired and went back to her hometown.

Luther and Oline Ingram were married and had three children.

- 1. Hazel Warrick, born 2 August 1916, m. Denard Wooten. They lived at Abbeville, Georgia where Hazel taught school and he was an accountant. Hazel still lives in Abbeyville, but Denard is deceased. They had no children.
- 2. Luther Frank Warrick, Jr., born 7 May 1918,

married Mildred Thrash. They live in Blakely and their children are:

- a. Luther F. Warrick III, born 22 November 1942, married Judy Finney. Their children are (1) Suzanne and (2) Luther Frank IV.
- b. Janice Warrick, b. 24 October 1946, married W. Claude Abercrombie. They live in Hawkinsville, Ga. Ch: (1) Christy, (2) Tisha, (3) Tey and (4) Jana.
- C. Alice Warrick, born 3 September 1954, married Luvon Fowler. Ch: (1) Clint, (2) Colin, and (3) Valerie.
- 3. James Edward Warrick, b. 8 May 1920, d. 7 December 1987, married Dorothy Vogle. Ch: (1) Star, (2) Brook (son)

Dad sold the Bicyle and Motorcycle Shop and bought land on the south side of the square, built a building and became a Dodge Automobile Dealer. He asked his brother, Alto, to come and work with him. Then Alto and the School Superintendent boarded with Mother and Dad. Later Dad sold the Dodge Agency to Uncle Alto and bought the Ford Agency which he ran until his death.

Dad was a Mason, a charter member of the Rotary Club and a long time City Councilman.

He persuaded a friend to lend the use of some property outside of town and built the first airport in Blakely. He sold aviation fuel and got may barnstorming planes, including a few Ford planes, to come to Blakely.

Dad bought the first radio (battery operated with earphones) in town. An electrician had built a radio a short time prior to this.

Dad bought the first electric refrigeration in town and was agent for G.E. He and two friends became the first Gulf Oil Agency in town, later to sell his interest.

Before my brother, James, was born in 1920, Dad almost died with a burst appendix. A few years later, he relapsed with flu, had pneumonia and flirted with death again and in 1924. Health problems haunted him then until death in 1933. He died in the Thomasville, Ga. Hospital and was buried with a Masonic Funeral at Blakely Cemetery in a hailstorm so bad that the family could not get out of the car.

> Dad loved people and never saw a stranger. He also was loved by young and old. He was very interested in progress and was always excited over new inventions. He seemed to draw troubled people like a magnet and never turned down anyones request for help.

Johnnie Oline Ingram Warrick, my mother, was born 16 November 1889 in Clay County, Georgia, just north of Early County, of which Blakely is the county seat. Her father was a farmer and their home was on a road which is now the highway between Blakely and

Columbus. We often passed the house when we went to visit a cousin and uncle of hers. When Stone Mountain was made into a state park, they wanted a typical farmhouse for the park. My mother's birthplace was selected for this and was moved to Stone Mountain.

Later the family moved to Calhoun County where Grand-dad became a big farmer, owning a cotton gin. They lived in a small community that contained several stores, and a one-romm schoolhouse which also served as a church. Times grew hard and Grand-dad had loaned money to friends who never repaid him and he lost most of his savings. They moved from there to Arlington, still in the same county.

Mother wanted to go to college, but Grand-dad didn't believe in higher education for women. His brother offered to pay her expenses, but he still refused.

Mother was an expert seamstress, so she started to sewing for others, saving her money, and buying reference books and other books to educate herself.

When she was born Grand-mother already had two girls. Grand-dad wanted a boy and planned to name him John. When he had another girl, he said "I'm going to name her Johnnie." Grandmother gave her the middle name Oline.

Dad didn't like the name Johnnie, so he called her "Oline" and introduced her to his family as Oline. All mother's people called her Johnnie.

Grand-dad didn't want any of the girls to marry. The two older ones ran away and married. Mother was going with a well-to-do widower in Arlington, Ga. and they planned to marry.

She wrote to a cousin, Miss Emma MacDonald, who ran a hotel (more like a boarding house) in Blakely and said she wanted to visit her. Dad boarded there and Miss Emma asked Dad to meet Mother at the train in his Model T.


That night while they were at the supper table, Mother's boy-friend came in drunk. She put an end to their engagement that night and Dad started courting her.

When they planned to marry, Dad came to see her one Sunday, drove to a preacher's house, got married and then drove to Blakely. There they caught a train to St. Augustine for their honeymoon. Her parents thought she was on a date, but soon they got a letter she wrote them telling them of her marriage.

I don't remember Grand-ma. She died of blood poisoning when I was about 4 years old. Mother's parents were James and Mary Ingram. Her two sisters are dead but her two brothers are yet living.
