Job Warrick, Sr.'s Children: Elizabeth, Benjamin, Josiah, Lewis, William Henry, Sallie, Nancy, Job Jr., John Thomas, Hezekiah, Wiley, Ezekial, James, Mary Jane, Alsey, Council, and Sallie.



The above picture is of the site of the Job Warrick, Sr. home place. Notice the large oak which is about 14 feet in circumference and has an interesting hole in one of the large limbs. Another oak stood on the opposite side of the house and the house was to rear and between the 2 oaks. There were also two sycamore trees that were tall enough to be seen from Grantham. According to information related by John Brown, grandson of Clarsey Brown Warrick, third wife of Job, the original house was built by Job Warrick, Sr. It consisted of a large 40' x 40' room built of 12" x 12" hewn logs with boards nailed horizontally over the cracks. Rafters and joists were also hewn. There was a wood frame shed room on each end of the house. The one on the left had 2

bedrooms and the one on the right had 1 large bedroom. Each bedroom had two beds. John's grandmother used the front bedroom on the left side, he said and she had a cord bed. He said all the furniture was homemade and that the windows consisted of 3' x 3' wood shutters and no glass. The large center room had a fireplace large enough to burn 4' wood. There was a shed porch on the front side. The roof was covered with boards and when they began curling, they were replaced by Charlie Starling using shingles he rived. The well curb seen in the photo is one built by Job, Sr. and the well was known as the best. They used a sweep and wooden bucket for drawing water. John said the house was torn down by his sister, Wadie Brown Chestnut about 1945. James Brown, son of Clarsey Brown Warrick, had the existing house that stands to the left of the well built in 1918 by a Warrick relative, Lewis Gainey. Wadie said she picked blueberries to pay for the doors and ceiling in the house. Wadie and John are both deceased. Information on the house was given in 1983 by John.

The Job Warrick, Sr. homestead site is about 2.6 miles northwest of Grantham, on the north side of State Road 1203 and 0.3 miles from State Road 1211. Photo made 1974.
